Texas NeuroRehab Center Earns Three-Year CARF Accreditation

Austin, TX, December 1, 2020 – Texas NeuroRehab Center is pleased to announce that the Commission on Accreditation of Rehab Facilities (CARF) International has accredited for a period of three years the Adult Residential Rehabilitation Program, known as the Tejas Post-Acute Brain Injury Program. Tejas is a 22-bed residential rehabilitation program for patients who have sustained a traumatic brain injury or stroke.

CARF accreditation represents the highest level of accreditation that can be given to an organization and demonstrates the organization's substantial conformance to the CARF standards. A Three-Year Accreditation is a rigorous peer review process. It has demonstrated to a team of surveyors during a virtual visit its commitment to offering programs and services that are measurable, accountable, and of the highest quality.

Texas NeuroRehab Center is a for-profit organization with facilities at 1106 W. Dittmar Road. It has been providing brain injury rehabilitation in the Austin area since 1986.

CARF is an independent, nonprofit accrediting body whose mission is to promote the quality, value, and optimal outcomes of services through a consultative accreditation process and continuous improvement services that center on enhancing the lives of the persons served.
